This Café Enterprise offers the ideal opportunity to develop many essential life skills including communication, working as a team, catering, handling money. It also importantly acknowledges our students and gives them the recognition that they are making a valuable contribution to society. Another important aspect is to provide a warm welcome to rest and relax. The importance of water for our mental, physical and spiritual refreshment and overall wellbeing is also another central theme.</p>

Caritas Love In Action Programme





Journey to Bethlehem





The Year of St Joseph



As you may be aware Pope Francis has declared an Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart") on the 80th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. On this occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from 2021 to 2029.

The Pope wrote *Patris corde* against the backdrop of the COVID-19 pandemic which has helped us see more clearly the importance of "being in the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day." The Holy Father described Saint Joseph as "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and humble worker who played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation."


Various activities to mark this special event.

Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes




We marked the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes – World Day of the Sick by having a special service.

As you know our school comes under Uxbridge Parish which is called Our Lady of Lourdes and St Michael, so it is a special day also for our local Parish.




Lent - Shrove Tuesday, Ash Wednesday
