

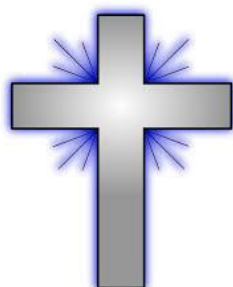
Catholic Life of Pield Heath School 2019-20








Upper School Retreat
