
PHHS Pathway 3 Formal Curriculum Careers and Employability Programme – Benchmark 1

To become more self-aware of their skills and attributes and be able to make informed choices about their future. To build confidence and self- advocacy as well as establish and manage relationships with others.

Aim:

Provide meaningful challenges that will help students develop participate in learning and to provide opportunities to develop a range of skills and techniques and attributes essential for successful engagement in life, community access, or work.

Students develop skills and confidence to engage in employability skills, develop communication skills, independence and experience jobs within a variety of contexts, leading then to make informed choices.
