

With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a

"Year of Saint Joseph" from 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021

The Holy Father wrote Patris corde against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation."



May – Patron of Workers


















St Joseph was a carpenter.

We too can use our hands like St Joseph. We can help others by living out various virtues such praying, loving and showing a good attitude.














Students work was used to create an ongoing display in the chapel
