3C have been investigating the properties of sound this term. The class made a variety of devices to show that sound is made and transferred through vibrations in the air. The boys made balloon drums on which they placed grains of rice. They discovered that the drum picked up vibrations form other sound sources as the rice began to "jump" on top of the drum. The students were able to notice a correlation between the volume of the sound made and the movement of the rice. A "Slinky" was used to demonstrate the longitudinal structure of a sound wave and much fun was had sending energy pulses along the spring.

This term in 3N we having been learning how to be independent when shopping. We have learnt how to find products using a shopping list and have become more confident when paying independently.

This term 3D have enjoyed taking part in a variety of activities including trampolining, swimming and yoga.

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






Tutor Group: 3S






Tutor Group: VBC A

This half term the winner is Sarah Whelan.




Easter Lego Challenge


Caritas 'Love in Action' Programme

In Spring Term 2 we have been looking at 'Creation'.




SiLENT for a Change
