Students who have managed to come to school have enjoyed some lovely activities.

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
Tutor Group - 3P

VBC A have used the time to develop some life skills. They have also enjoyed doing some fun activities outdoors.


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Tutor Group - VBC B






Tutor Group - VBC C

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


We were delighted to hear the news on 15th June about the reopening of churches for Private Prayer.
