We enjoyed various arts and crafts activities which have helped us to get to know each other better in our group. We also enjoyed our cookery lesson and our class parties.










Tutor Group - 3L

We enjoyed our PE lessons and trying out the different equipment in the Gym.






Tutor Group - PH+A






Tutor Group - 4M






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
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




Tutor Group - 4T

Updates from the Therapies Team

Our Therapy Team includes 3 Speech and Language Therapists (SALT) and an Occupational Therapists (OT).

Our Speech and Language Therapists are Sara Ali (SALT lead), Petrece McLeod and Lydia Chong. They support learners to communicate functionally and effectively throughout the day across home, school and community settings. SALTs work closely with teaching staff to develop learners' attention and listening skills (e.g. ability to focus on a task), understanding of language (e.g. ability to follow instructions, understand vocabulary), use of language (e.g. verbal communication, PECS, communication books), speech (e.g. producing sounds correctly within words), and social communication skills (e.g. turn taking, self-awareness, conversations).

Our Occupational Therapist, Bhindu Odedra, helps our learners to maintain calm alertness through sensory strategies and to optimise their independent functioning at school and at home by developing attention skills, gross motor skills, fine motor skills, visual-motor skills, emotional regulation skills, self-care skills, and provision of adaptive equipment.

The therapy team is led by Bhindu Odedra, Clinical Lead for Therapies Team.

The Year of St Joseph

As you may be aware Pope Francis has declared a special Year of St Joseph. With the Apostolic Letter "Patris corde" ("With a Father's Heart"), Pope Francis recalls the 150th anniversary of the declaration of Saint Joseph as Patron of the Universal Church. To mark the occasion, the Holy Father has proclaimed a "Year of Saint Joseph" from 8 December 2020, to 8 December 2021.

The Pope wrote *Patris corde* against the backdrop of the Covid-19 pandemic, which, he says, has helped us see more clearly the importance of "ordinary" people who, though far from the limelight, exercise patience and offer hope every day. In this, they resemble Saint Joseph, "the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence," who nonetheless played "an incomparable role in the history of salvation."During this year, we plan to be do various activities to mark this special event.

In Spring Term 1 we have been looking at ways in which we can highlight the principle of Option for the Poor.

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
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Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes
