Overview


Remote home learning is a new approach to your child's education which is a direct response to unforeseen and unpredictable circumstances. It is an approach which both the school, parents and students are adapting to.

The purpose of remote home learning is not to attempt to replicate the classroom at home. This would not be practical for you to do and would not be a positive experience for your child.

The purpose of remote home learning is rather an adaptable approach to ensuring your child's learning continues in the best format for your child - delivered flexibly to meet the needs of both your child and the rest of your family.

Reading with your child

- E reading books can be accessed through a free online site called Oxford Owl.

- You will have to register with your e mail account and a password but there is no cost or obligation to joining the site. Once you have joined and logged in you will need to go to the e-Books icon. Then go to the smaller e-Books icon. You will then be able to open books at the stage appropriate to your child. Many books have activities at the end. Please ensure you ask your child who, what, where, why and when questions about the book at the end. If your child struggles with any of the words in a book you can ask them to learn the spelling of that word and test them later in the week.
