Pield Heath House is a non-maintained school in Uxbridge, West London for children and young people with special educational needs between the ages of 7-19.

Judged 'outstanding' by Ofsted at our last three inspections we offer day, residential and respite provision for those with moderate to severe learning difficulties, complex learning needs including autistic spectrum disorders, and associated speech, language and communication difficulties.

St Joseph's, our purpose-built, self-contained house within the school grounds, offers both weekly (Monday-Thursday) residential and short break care.

The Boarding Experience

The 24 hour curriculum is designed to help our young people with social, independence and life skills in particular. Support is highly individualised and students are actively encouraged to make choices in all aspects of their care, support and entertainment. This has a very positive impact on their families, decreases dependency and makes real the prospect of students becoming more independent in their adult lives.

The house provides accommodation for both genders and is fully equipped with its own single bedrooms, kitchen, dining room, lounge, activity room, gym, toilets, bathroom, shower facilities, office and garden area. Bathroom facilities are fitted with appropriate aids and adaptations and all our young people are encouraged and supported to personalise their own rooms with pictures and photographs.



Care and Support

Our dedicated residential care staff team support our young people and foster their social and life skills programmes, forming a close bond and building a level of trust to help solve any social, emotional or personal problems that may arise.

Students are involved in all aspects of life at St Joseph's and seeking the views of residential students is central to practice. There are regular meetings at which their opinions are sought about planning events, routines and activities. Students are encouraged to take part in daily tasks such as cooking dinner, laying the table, unpacking their bags, to develop life skills and increase their independence.



Extra-Curricular Activities

An important part of the 24 hour residential curriculum are activities which take place every evening.

Students participate in:

- Cooking
- Tai Chi
- Art Club
- 2 External Youth Clubs

In addition there are sports activities in the school grounds and a regular programme of trips including ten pin bowling, theatre, circus and dining out. All of which are chosen not only for the enjoyment of students but also for developing their confidence and experience of tasks such as using public transport and ordering food in a restaurant.
